Bishop Lynch High School is a co-educational college preparatory institution providing a well-rounded education for students in grades nine through twelve.

The school is directed by a School Board elected from the Bishop Lynch community and is administered by a President and Principal.

Located on 22 acres at the corner of Ferguson and Peavy Roads in Northeast Dallas, the facilities include the main school building, gymnasium, theater, football stadium, field house and athletic complex. Additional buildings house the visual arts classes and the business offices.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Each student is required to complete 60 hours of outside community service through their junior year. Additionally, each senior completes more than 100 hours of community service as a supplement to their Social Issues Theology course.

TRANSCRIPT INFORMATION

All grades that appear on the transcript are un-weighted. The weighting factor is reflected in the GPA. Bishop Lynch does not use Physical Education grades when calculating the GPA. The fall semester of band and dance/drill team, as well as cheerleading are considered PE courses. Dance can be either a Fine Art or PE course. This is reflected in the course title.

GRADING SYSTEM

Bishop Lynch High School uses a numeric grading system on a 100-point scale. Credit is awarded for a semester grade of 70 or above. A semester consists of two nine-week quarters. Students may receive a "final pass" for earning a 77 or higher in the spring semester following a fall failure in math, foreign language and chemistry courses only.

DUAL ENROLLMENT AND ADVANCED/AP COURSES

Utilizing the talents of over seventeen instructors who are also adjunct professors, Bishop Lynch has the largest private school dual enrollment program in the state of Texas. 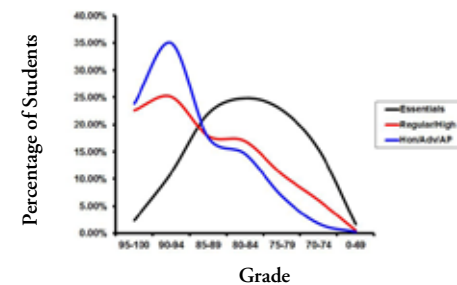

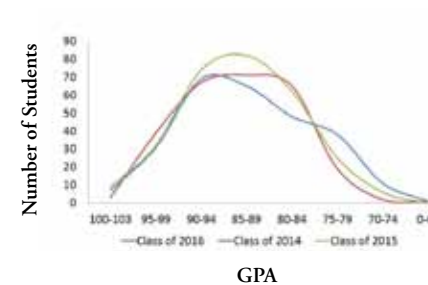

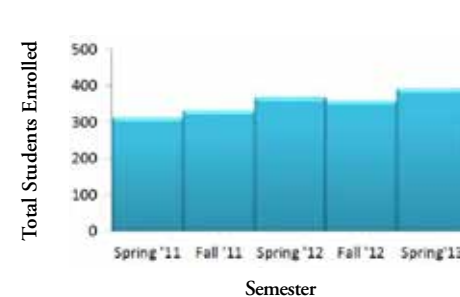
Grade Distribution Based on Course Level
